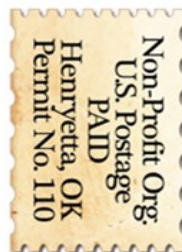

DOM's Deliberations

Part One:

As I sit here this morning, considering how our associational structure is being transformed to make us more intentional in ministries such as evangelism, discipleship, church revitalization and missions while at the same time maintaining the high levels of fellowship that we enjoy and that binds us together, I am amazed at how far God has already brought us. In this process, it is important that we understand the role that God has given us.
