Part Two:

I am currently re-reading an old book on looking at the world through a positive lens. The name of the book is See You At The Top by Zig Ziglar.

Ziglar, was not only a motivational speaker, but he was also the former first vice president of the Southern Baptist Convention in 1984-1985 and a renowned author.

In his book, Ziglar shares many lines of folk wisdom that should seem obvious, but I believe that we would do ple in our communities see us"? While we may be able to well to consider them today. Taking on the task to restructure into the most effective Association of Churches possible where God has placed us is no easy matter, but neither is it impossibly difficult.

Let's look at some of Ziglar's wisdom. He states that "an in-depth look reveals more than a casual glance." Of course, this is true, but we often fail to do it. Why is that? productive, but if something does need to be changed to Probably because we just don't see that there is a need. Ziglar goes on to say that we may need some outside help to open our eyes. He states "most of us occasionally need someone to point out the obvious and more often, the not so obvious."

Let me illustrate. Have you ever walked into a home where multiple cats are family pets? If so, you have probably been met by an obvious odor that the homeowner no longer notices out of constant familiarity. The same can be true in our churches and our association. There are likely several things that we no longer notice, but when a visitor or new member arrives, they are guite obvious to them.

A good question to ask ourselves is "how do the peosee some of the difficult areas, most likely we cannot see them all because we have gotten used to them. What would happen if we had an outsider secretly drop in unannounced, and then report back later with what they saw? That might be eye opening indeed.

Again, change just for the sake of change is rarely help us be obedient to the Great Commission then why are we holding back? It's something to think about.
